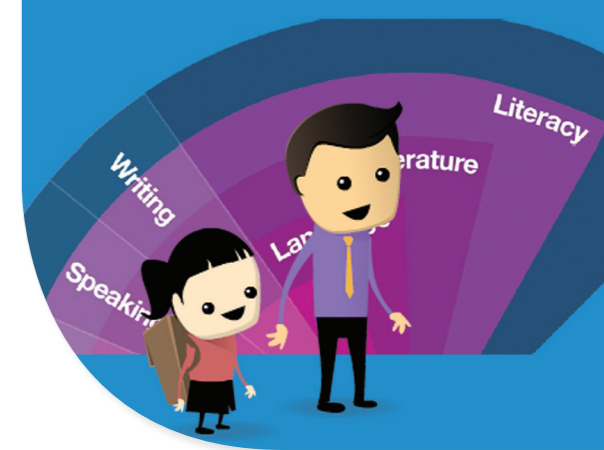


F – 2 English Placemat
